The Dean writes.....

Dear Parishioners and Friends

Jesus, just before He ascended to Heaven, spoke words to His disciples. Those words contained a promise and offered them assurance and confidence for all that they would encounter

in their mission and service.

'Remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age'. Saint Matthew 28: 20.

Three years earlier, Jesus had chosen those men to be His followers. They were men of different ages and backgrounds but in each of them Jesus saw the potential for useful living. Under His guidance and leadership they became a great team.

Now that Jesus was going to leave them, things were going to be very different. The centre of their world would be missing. The One who had been able to provide the direction for their lives and the solutions to their problems would not be with them.

So, as Jesus gave them instructions (**Go and make disciples of all nations**) He realised their dilemma and He promised them that they would never be alone. **'I am with you always, to the end of the age'.**

That is a promise that He kept because ten days later, at Pentecost / Whitsunday, He returned in the Person of the Holy Spirit. As the disciples ministered to other people they discovered that what Jesus had said was indeed true and they could say with confidence, **'The Lord is here. His Spirit is with us'.**

We are human and, like those disciples, we meet problems and difficulties in the course of our lives. We can find it difficult to know what to do when we experience negative forces. We long to be able to turn to someone who has all of the answers.

The promise contained in the words of Jesus was a promise not for the disciples only but for people of every place and time. It is a promise that we, today, can believe and accept, and because of that promise we can meet the difficulties and challenges of life with renewed zeal and courage.

God does not desert His people in their time of need. That is the message we find in the Scriptures, It is a message that is worth remembering.

God made a promise to Joshua. **'Be strong and courageous; do not be frightened or dismayed, for the Lord your God is with you wherever you go'.** Joshua 1: 9.

God spoke through the prophet Isaiah: **'Do not fear, for I have redeemed you; I have called you by name, you are mine. When you pass through the waters, I will be with you; and through the rivers, they shall not overwhelm you; when you walk through fire you shall not be burned, and the flame shall not consume you. For I am the Lord your God, the Holy One of Israel, your Saviour.** Isaiah 43: 1-3.

This is God's promise that He will be with us **when** we face difficulties.

Notice that He says **when** and not **if**.

The trials of life may be different for each of us but none of us can escape the reality of certain trials at some time in our lives. Whatever those trials may be we should never feel discouraged, isolated, alone.

God has promised, Jesus has promised, that He will be with us at all times.

That is a promise He will never fail to keep. It is a promise that can help us when we experience the sorrows – and also the joys – of daily life. Our personal experience of the fulfilment of that promise will enable us to make these words our own.

**Through all the changing scenes of life,
in trouble and in joy,
the praises of my God shall still
my heart and tongue employ.** Hymn 372

THE PARISH OF MAGHERA AND KILLELAGH (SWATRAGH)

The Reverend Jonathan Brown, the Curate-assistant in The Parish of Hillsborough in The Dioceses of Down and Dromore was appointed the Rector of The Parishes of Maghera and Killelagh (Swatragh) in March.

He succeeds The Reverend Terry Kerr who retired in September of last year.

The Reverend Jonathan Brown will be instituted Rector of the Parish of Maghera and Killelagh (Swatragh) in Saint Lurach's Church, Maghera on the Feast Day of Saint Columba, Thursday 9th June.

THE PARISH OF DONAGHEADY (DONEMANA)

The Parish of Donagheady (Donemana) is to get a new incumbent later this year. The Reverend Captain Richard Beadle has been appointed to succeed The Reverend Dr Robin Stockitt who retired almost a year ago.

The news was shared with worshippers at Saint James' Church in Donemana and parishioners in the Manorhamilton Group of Parishes, in the Diocese of Kilmore, which The Reverend Beadle has been overseeing as Bishop's Curate since his Ordination in September 2017.

The Reverend Beadle has been an active Church Army Officer since 1998 and before being commissioned had worked in the Employment Service in the UK. His work as a Church Army evangelist took him to parishes in Nelson, East Lancashire; Saint Matthew's on Belfast's Woodvale Road; and the rural Swanlinbar-Kildallon Group of Parishes in the Diocese of Kilmore.

THE FEAST DAY OF SAINT COLUMBA / GIFT DAY

A Gift Day will be held in Saint Columb's Cathedral on the Feast Day of Saint Columba, Thursday 9th June 2022.

The Dean / Canon John Merrick will be in attendance, 10.00 a.m. – 2.00 p.m.

We hope that the response to this Appeal will offset the expenses incurred in three relatively costly works in the Cathedral.

- We need, as a matter of some urgency, to address a number of 'wear and tear' problems with the Cathedral Organ. This will involve scaffolding and will be of one week duration.
- The software which enables programming of the heating system for services and events requires replacement as it is now out of date and will soon become unavailable.
- There has been an ingress of water in the Chapter House which has become increasingly worse. This has now been identified and a section of lead guttering requires to be replaced.

We plan to undertake these necessary works as soon as possible and most certainly by the end of July.

The cost of these works will be c. £15,000.

I believe that many people care enough for Saint Columb's Cathedral to want to be associated with this Gift Day Appeal and will want to support the Cathedral with a financial contribution. I believe that **YOU** are one of these people and I thank you for your support.



Unfortunately we had to cancel our May meeting as it clashed with the re-scheduled Vestry meeting. However it was lovely to see so many of you at the Open Garden Day at Creevagh House either working hard or supporting it with your time, talents and

money. It was a very successful day financially and socially and helped everyone of us to feel that life might at last be returning to something near normality. Thank you to everyone involved.

We also need your help to make sure we can continue to supply the Dorcas Packs to those being baptised. As you know these are much appreciated by the families involved. We have a few blankets and toys but we will also need more toys and blankets quite soon so if you can knit or crochet and would like to help please get in touch with either of us to ensure this tradition now continues. Thank you and we will even supply wool.

We hope to be able to organise a get-together during the Summer and will keep in touch. Hopefully we will all be able to enjoy some sun over the next few months.







MISSION FOCUS – THE BIBLE SOCIETY IN SRI LANKA

Many Christians in Sri Lanka cannot access the Bible by themselves due to a visual or hearing impairment, leaving them feeling isolated and unable to understand God's Word for themselves.

The Sri Lankan Bible Society provides audio and Braille Bibles for those with visual impairments, allowing them to access the Bible when they want. They work closely with local churches and Schools for the Blind.

They are also working on the translation of the Bible into Sri Lankan Sign Language, allowing those who are deaf to connect and understand God's Word. The written language is often very different to the Sign Language, so this project is vital to Christians whose heart language is the Sri Lankan Sign Language.
