#### Dear Parishioners and Friends

On Saturday 6<sup>th</sup> May 2023 the Coronation of His Majesty King Charles III will be held in Westminster Abbey.

King Charles III will be crowned and then in a similar, but simpler, ceremony at the same service Her Majesty Camilla, the Queen Consort, will be crowned.

The Coronation is based on a solemn ceremony that has remained largely unchanged for more than 1000 years. For the past 900 years the ceremony has been held at

Westminster Abbey and is conducted by the Archbishop of Canterbury.

I know that one member of this Parish has been invited to attend the Coronation.

As he sits in Westminster Abbey, and as we sit in Saint Columb's Cathedral and view the Service on the big screen, I wonder what thoughts will be in our minds.

We will perhaps be impressed by the ceremonial of the occasion. We will listen with great interest to the music and to the words of the Service. We will follow intently the questions that will be asked and the answers that King Charles will give in response.

But our first response to the Coronation Service should be a resolve to pray for King Charles III.

Whatever our views and opinions he is a leader who will need and who will appreciate the prayers of many people. We have a duty to pray for our King and for those in authority. Writing to Timothy, Paul encourages prayer for all people.

First of all, I urge that supplications, prayers, intercessions, and thanksgivings, be made for everyone, for kings and all who are in high positions, so that we may lead a quiet and peaceable life in all godliness and dignity. This is right and is acceptable in the sight of God our Saviour, who desires everyone to be saved and to come to the knowledge of the truth. (1 Timothy 2: 1-4).

The role that King Charles III has undertaken is an onerous role but it is one for which he has been preparing for 70 years. His has been the longest apprenticeship ever! Yet, he has been influenced, guided and encouraged by a godly mentor – his mother, the late Queen Elizabeth II. He has seen her Christian faith in action.

He has witnessed her popularity and seen how people from all over the world and from all of the countries of the Commonwealth loved and respected her.

He has seen at first hand how her death, just a few months ago, brought the Nation and Commonwealth to a standstill.

As he reflects on her long life and reign as Queen he will, hopefully, be seeking to follow in her footsteps and at the same time placing his own unique stamp on the Monarchy.

To that end let us resolve to pray for him. We do so in the Daily Office when we pray O Lord, save the King / and mercifully hear us when we call upon thee, and in the Service of Holy Communion when we pray We beseech thee also to save and defend all Christian Kings, Princes, and Governors; and especially thy servant CHARLES our King; that under him we may be godly and quietly governed:

#### A PRAYER FOR KING CHARLES III

(Based on a prayer in the 1953 Coronation Service)

Lord God, in your power you provide for your people and rule over them in love. Give to your servant Charles our King the spirit of wisdom and government, that being devoted to you with his whole heart he may so wisely govern that during his reign your church may be protected, and Christian devotion may continue in peace; that so persevering in good works to the end, he may by your mercy enter your everlasting kingdom; through Jesus Christ, your Son, our Lord, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God now and for ever. Amen.

- **10 facts about King Charles III** He was born at 9.14 pm on 14<sup>th</sup> November 1948, to Princess Elizabeth and Prince Philip, • at Buckingham Palace in London.
- He has been heir-apparent to the throne since he was three years old.
- He is the first monarch in British history to have earned a university degree. From 1967 to 1970 he studied History at Cambridge University.
- He can speak Welsh. He spent two months learning the language in 1969 as he prepared to become the Prince of Wales. He still speaks it today.
- He is a qualified pilot and diver. While serving in the Military in the 1970s he trained as a jet and helicopter pilot and became a confident diver.
- He is a keen watercolour painter, a published author, and a music lover who played the cello at Cambridge. He has appeared on television: making a guest appearance on Coronation Street, and presenting the BBC weather forecast.
- As Prince of Wales he founded 20 charities. Together, they raise £140 million each year for good causes. He is passionate about the environment, speaking out against plastic pollution as early as 1970. He has planted many trees during royal engagements.
- Aged 73, King Charles III is the oldest monarch ever to be crowned in British history. He became King on 8<sup>th</sup> September 2022 after the death of his mother, Queen Elizabeth II.
- As head of the Commonwealth, King Charles III is monarch of each of the 14 Commonwealth realms: Antigua and Barbuda, Australia, Bahamas, Belize, Canada, Grenada, Jamaica, New Zealand, Papua New Guinea, Saint Kitts & Nevis, Saint Lucia, Saint Vincent & The Grenadines, The Solomon Islands, and Tuvalu. As King he is the only person in the UK who can travel abroad in the Commonwealth without a passport and drive without a licence.
- King Charles III has two children, Prince William and Prince Harry, and five grandchildren. Prince William is next in line to become King and was named the Prince of Wales in 2022.


The readings (Ecclesiastes 4: 9-12 and 1 Corinthians 13: 4-8) were read by lain Westhead and Kyle Thompson.



#### From the House of Bishops : the Administration of the Holy Communion

From time to time, during and since the Covid 19 pandemic, the bishops have sought to offer counsel to the wider church particularly concerning the manner of the administration of the Holy Communion. In all our statements, we have sought to combine seemliness and safety and to take the best professional advice available to us.

It is approximately a year now since we encouraged the restored use of the common cup at Holy Communion. This is the traditional Anglican practice in relation to the administration of the sacrament, and is enshrined in the formularies of the Book of Common Prayer. The sharing of the Cup of the Lord is rich in meaning and value for the communicant, and only in the most extraordinary medical emergency could we take it upon ourselves to advise that the cup should be withdrawn, or that the consecrated wine of the Eucharist should be administered by other temporary means such as individual vessels.

We recognised a year ago that it would take some time for the cup to be restored across the whole church, that there would for a while need to be a degree of variety of practice, and that the position of those who remained nervous about receiving from it should be respected. Nevertheless, cognisant of the present situation in terms of public health, and mindful of professional wisdom which indicates the extremely low risk associated with the transmission of infection via a shared silver vessel containing the fermented fruit of the vine and used in an ordered liturgical context, we have all agreed to provide the following directions to the church. We believe we are doing this in a situation where in fact the common cup has already been largely restored around the parishes of the Church of Ireland. specific permissions given by individual bishops for the use of individual vessels at Holy Communion will lapse after Pentecost Sunday 2023

- Thereafter the administration of the consecrated wine at Holy Communion in our churches should involve the common cup only
- Those who remain for their own reasons nervous about receiving from the common cup should be respected, and they should receive in one kind only, with an assurance that the Church teaches that the sacrament can be fully received in one kind
- People who are obviously the victims of infections that involve coughing and sneezing should probably think twice before coming to church, and certainly out of courtesy to others should show temporary gracious restraint in not seeking to receive from the common cup
- We ask that communicants do not themselves intinct (dip) the consecrated bread they have received in the wine. This is based on clear medical advice - intinction can spread infection from fingers to the wine, and crumbs of bread left in the wine can be problematical for other people who wish to receive it, eg coeliacs
- Chalices should be kept scrupulously clean, and washed with very hot soapy water after services before being put away. Defects on chalices eg torn lips should be professionally repaired
- It is generally held that noble metal rather than pottery vessels can be used more hygienically
- It is really important that chalices be wiped fully using clean cloth (preferably linen) purificators. The use of tissues can spread infection ; the use of proper cloth purificators significantly diminishes it.

In issuing this guidance we are concerned that communicants feel safe, that they conduct themselves with mutual courtesy, and that above all the supper of the Lord is administered with reverence and with joy. The long period during which the common cup had to be withdrawn only served to remind us of how precious a thing it is, how full of Scriptural resonances, how it speaks to us of our utter equality before God as we gather in sacramental unity, how the beauty of its meaning must never be taken for granted. In that spirit we pray that the full restoration of the common cup, surrounded of course by care and courtesy, can be for the whole Church of Ireland a matter of the greatest joy.


