## The Dean writes.....

Dear Parishioners and Friends

In the morning, while it was still very dark, he (Jesus) got up and went out to a deserted place, and there he prayed.

*(Saint Mark 1: 35).*

The Season of Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, 2<sup>nd</sup> March. This is the traditional time of the Church's Year when we reflect of Jesus' life, focusing particularly on the forty days and nights that He spent in a deserted place in prayer. In that place Jesus was confronted by the Devil (Satan) who tempted Him by offering Him three choices.

To turn stones into bread. To throw Himself from the pinnacle of the Temple.

To accept the gift of all the kingdoms of the world in return for worshipping Satan.

Jesus resisted the subtle temptations of the Devil by focusing His mind and thoughts on God and His Word.

Three times He was tempted and three times He found comfort and strength from the Word and Promises of God.

As we journey through life we encounter many different situations. Some are pleasant and easy to deal with. Others can be quite stressful, challenging and very unpleasant.

It, often, is when we are sick or lonely, when we are weak – physically, emotionally and spiritually – literally at the point of our greatest need – that such testing times come.

At such times we need – and must seek – help and comfort from outside of our own resources.

Our family, friends and neighbours can often offer great support when we really need it but, sometimes, they may feel ill-prepared and may offer reasons why they cannot help; but, perhaps, the greatest help that they can offer is simply to be by our side, willing to listen as we try to articulate our concerns.

When we feel the weight of the world on our shoulders, when we wish that the times of testing would go away, it is helpful to turn to a trusted friend whom we know will accept us as we are. There will not be words of judgement or of condemnation. In fact, words may not be spoken at all. Instead, we may find ourselves restored as we draw strength from their quiet, confident presence.

Isn't it the case that when words have been long forgotten it is acts of compassion and kindness that will be most remembered.

**I expect to pass through this world but once; any good thing therefore that I can do, or any kindness that I can show to any fellow-creature, let me do it now; let me not defer or neglect it, for I shall not pass this way again.**

In the midst of all the uncertainties we are living under due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the WDP theme is a balm of confidence. It is an invitation to place our trust in God in times of suffering.

## Monday 21st February - Sunday 6th March 2022

For two weeks each year at the end of February and beginning of March, thousands of individuals, companies and groups across the UK come together to share the stories of the people who grow our food and drinks, mine our gold and who grow the cotton in our clothes, people who are often exploited and underpaid.

Since last year, the G7 and COP26 have both taken place. Over 33,000 campaigners joined 1.8m Fairtrade farmers and workers in backing the Be Fair With Your Climate Promise challenge to world leaders at the UN COP26 summit. But frustration came as the wealthiest nations failed to recognise the urgent need to invest in farmer expertise by delaying their promised \$100bn annual funding to the most climate vulnerable countries until 2023.

Throughout the fortnight, an online *Choose the World you Want* Festival will run with people coming together in a show of support for the farmers behind our food on the front line of the climate crisis.

**Please pray for fairness and justice in all economic dealings** and especially for small producers in developing economies, that they may receive a fair price for what they produce. Pray that consumers make informed choices.

We are all part of the Fairtrade movement and have the power to drive long-term change, not only with our shopping choices but in spreading the message. What difference will you make during Fairtrade Fortnight this year?

### Fairtrade Recipe: Banana and Chocolate Muffins

#### Ingredients

- 300g plain flour
- 1 tbsp baking powder
- 125g Fairtrade Demerara sugar
- 225ml milk
- 2 large free-range eggs, beaten
- 125g butter, melted
- 2 Fairtrade bananas, mashed
- 100g Fairtrade chocolate, chopped into small pieces



#### Method

- Preheat the oven to 180 deg fan.
- Place 12 muffin cases in a 12-hole muffin tin.
- Sieve the flour into mixing bowl, stir in baking powder, then sugar.
- Add eggs to milk and stir in melted butter.
- Stir in bananas and chocolate.
- Add wet mixture to dry and stir well.
- Spoon into muffin cases.
- Bake 20 – 25 mins until well risen and golden. Enjoy!



## New Mothers' Union Chaplain

Bishop Andrew has appointed The Reverend Liz Fitzgerald as the Diocesan Chaplain of Mothers' Union in Derry and Raphoe, in succession to The Reverend Canon Katie McAteer who stepped down from the position after November's '16 Days of Activism' Service at Saint Columb's Cathedral.

During that time, the Covid-19 pandemic has made life extremely challenging for many of our families and friends and neighbours; but despite the virus's impact, our Mothers' Union has responded faithfully to Christ's call and made its presence felt. In particular, it has shown remarkable leadership in the campaigns against domestic and gender-based violence.

"I am thrilled that Liz is following in Katie's footsteps, now. Liz has already made a significant contribution to Mothers' Union's ministry in Derry and Raphoe, and I'm confident that under her guidance, and with God's help, MU will continue to serve Christ faithfully and to bless people's lives in our diocese."



**Christine Margaret Edwards**  
**4<sup>th</sup> January 1947 – 1<sup>st</sup> February 2022**

We meet this morning with mixed feelings and emotions. There is a sense of sadness for you the members of Christine's family because in the death of Christine you have lost someone whom you loved.

Someone who helped you along the journey of life. Someone who advised you, comforted you and shared your joys and sorrows, your highs and lows. From today, that source of help and support is no longer available to you as it was in the past. In a way, you are now required to go out into the world on your own and to fend for yourself.

But there is also a sense of thanksgiving this morning as in this reflection and in the silence of your own hearts you remember Christine – the different aspects of her life – as you remember her as your older sister, the loving mother and the devoted grandmother and great grandmother.

You are the people who are the best placed to reflect on Christine's life because she has been with you over many years. She has been the person who shared your joys and sorrows; the person to whom you turned for advice or support. She has been your rock at all times.

Christine Margaret Edwards was born on 4<sup>th</sup> January 1947 – just over 75 years ago. She was the eldest of nine children born to Ernest (Eddie) and Maureen Edwards. Her siblings are Terry (deceased), Janice, Vanessa (deceased), Joanna, Vivien, Nigel, Diane and Paul.

After leaving school Christine, like many young girls and women in this City, found employment in one of the many shirts factories that were a feature of life here a generation ago. For Christine, it was in Tillie and Henderson's Shirt Factory that she worked and where she made her friends.

Her time here was short because just a few years later at the age of 18 years she moved to England.

Away from home the work ethic that she had learned in this City enabled her to find employment and for many years she worked in the Catering Industry, as a cook in many of the well established hotels in England.

Married life gave Christine a family of six children – Shanta, Darryn, Zarah, Clare, Lisa and Anthony.

For 31 years Christine made England her home base but she decided to return to Londonderry and she set up her home here in Sperrin Park in 1996.

As the eldest of her family, I suspect that Christine was a kind of matriarchal figure. Someone who cared for her siblings, her children, her 14 grandchildren and her one great grandchild.

And I suspect that all of you can rise up today and call her blessed. You can be proud to have had her as your mother, as your sister, as your grandmother and great grandmother. Today, as you say your earthly farewell to Christine, remember her with love. Give thanks for every memory that you have of her. And I hope that you can echo the words of Saint Paul –

**I thank my God every time I remember you.**

There is sadness and there is thanksgiving in your feelings and emotions this morning.

But I believe that there is also a real sense of **hope**. You do not need to feel despondent, lost and alone today. It will be natural for you to feel like this and to wonder how you are going to face the future.

The Christian life is about hope, transformation, new life.

As we live our lives in the presence of Jesus, the Risen Lord, we can find that hope.

We are shown the reality that death is not the final curtain. It is not the final destiny for those whom Jesus loves. It is a temporary parting of our ways, of our lives – but there will come a time, there will come a day, when we will see our loved ones again. That will be a glorious day – something to keep hoping and living for.

It is the thought of being re-united with those whom we love and have lost for a while that can keep us from grieving endlessly and can enable us to move forward with our lives.


