Dear Parishioners and Friends

According to the Cambridge Dictionary, the word 'resolution' has the meaning 'a promise to yourself to do something

or not to do something'. This word creeps into our vocabulary at certain times of the year. At the beginning of a New Year.

Many people continue the tradition of making a New Year Resolution. They look at their lives and admit that it would be good to do something positive, so they promise to be more active, to spend more time helping in the community, doing things that will benefit the lives of other people. Sadly however New Year Resolutions, while well-meaning, can be short-lived.

At the beginning of Lent.

On Ash Wednesday, people again look at their lives, realise that now would be a good time to do something positive; to give something up or to take something up. This time there are only six weeks of self-discipline rather than the twelve months of a New Year Resolution. And during the Season of Lent many people do succeed in what they have decided to do. It may be to come to church more often, to attend the Mid-week Service, to attend the Bible Study Group, or to contribute to the work of a charitable organisation.

Another time when we might think about making a resolution is at the beginning of a new Church/Parish Year.

This is something that all of us could think about now as we embark on a new Church/Parish Year. The Sunday School re-opens, the familiar pattern of worship returns, 'the playing of the merry organ and the sweet singing in the quire' that has been absent for the past months, resumes today.

The parish organisations – The Mothers' Union and The Men's Society – have planned a series of interesting meetings that will, hopefully, attract parishioners and people from other parishes too.

A new Church/Parish Year could make us think again about our commitment to our parish. Could we attend church more regularly? Could we play a more active part in the life of the church?

Church attendance since COVID-19 has not improved in the way that we had hoped. For whatever reasons, the faithful parishioners who were among those who worshipped with us before COVID have not returned to their place of worship. This first Sunday in September could be the day when you think about your life, realise that you have put off the decision for too long and that it is time to 'come home'.

You will notice in the magazine that the theme of the Harvest Celebrations this year is 'Going Home'.

On Sunday 1st October we look forward to welcoming back to the Cathedral people who were baptised, confirmed or married here, or who attended Sunday School, the Choir or the Youth Organisations.

It would be great to see the Cathedral well filled with parishioners and former parishioners, with people who are 'Going Home'.

But this is all in the future! We have to think about today – the here and now.

So, I invite you to think and to pray, to decide, and to make a positive resolution to return to church and to play a more active part in the life of the Cathedral.

I can assure you that a warm welcome awaits you when you step through the doors of this Cathedral Church to worship God in the company of all His faithful people.

Carole's and Alan's great great grandfather was Albert Alford who, along with his son, designed and carved the 250 pew heads between 1855 and 1862.

With the help of Morris and Shirley Forbes we were able to discover additional information about Albert.

His parents were Albert and Fanny Alford.

He was born in London in 1817.

He died at Butcher Street, Londonderry on 25th February 1865 aged 48 years.

Cause of death: Cholera. He was buried in a pauper's grave in The City Cemetery, Londonderry on 27th February 1865.




Listen!

DIOCESAN NEWS

The Dioceses of Derry and Raphoe is to get its first female dean following the appointment of The Reverend Liz Fitzgerald as Rector of The Grouped Parishes of Raphoe, Raymochy (Manorcunningham) and Clonleigh (Lifford) and Dean of Saint Eunan's Cathedral, Raphoe. The Reverend Liz Fitzgerald says she is looking forward to the challenge. "Being invited to be Rector of the Raphoe Group and Dean of Saint Eunan's Cathedral is very exciting and I'm really looking forward to it." She will miss her parishippers in west Denogal

and I'm really looking forward to it." She will miss her parishioners in west Donegal. "My part of Donegal – Bunbeg, Carrickfin, Dungloe – is beautiful, and what makes it beautiful is the good, kind people, my parishioners, and the people in the community."

Saturday 23rd September (Saint Eunan's Day) has been set for The Reverend Liz Fitzgerald's institution as Rector and installation as Dean.

"On behalf of the Diocese, I wish to express my gratitude to Liz for her generous and faith-filled witness in Gweedore, Carrickfin and Templecrone. The Right Reverend Andrew Forster says that The Reverend Chris Matchett's decision to accept the position of Priest-in-Charge of Clondevaddock and Mevagh is wonderful news for the Dioceses of Derry and Raphoe and for the parishioners in north Donegal. Scripture translation depends on its readers being literate – unfortunately, it is simply useless to have a Bible translation if the intended people group cannot access it for themselves.

This is why The Bible Society in Cambodia runs over 500 literacy classes a year for both disadvantaged Christians and non-Christians.

Literacy courses are open to anyone who needs to learn to read and write Khmer, one of the most widely spoken languages in Cambodia. It runs throughout 24 provinces in Cambodia where each week groups gather in villages to study together.

This is a Bible-based programme with the groups studying portions of Scripture together. Not only does it introduce people to the Word of God but it also increases their employment opportunities and quality of life. Once a person has completed the course he/she is given a copy of the New Testament in Khmer to take home and keep.

Obituaries

Margaret Plews 19th December 1952 – 23rd August 2023

We have come here today to remember our dear sister Margaret, to give thanks for her life, to leave her in the keeping of God her creator, redeemer and judge, to commit her body to be buried, and to comfort one another in our grief, in the hope that is ours through the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ.

These words from the Funeral Service printed in The Book of Common Prayer tell us what the purpose of 'a tribute / address' should be.

It should include some reference to the person who has died, looking back to her early years, remembering perhaps the kind of work that she did and the interests that she had.

There should be some reference to her husband and family.

A tribute should be an opportunity to assure relatives of the church's and the community's sympathy and prayers.

It should not be a long dark eulogy but should have hope at its centre.

Family and friends should be encouraged to remember that the person who has died is no longer in pain and distress.

At the point of death the old life disappears and a new life emerges to be lived in the safety and security of God's presence.

Margaret was born on 19th December 1952 in Falkirk, Stirlingshire in Scotland. I don't have details of her childhood or early years but I have been told that on some date in the 1970's something dramatic happened in her life.

Albert Plews and his cousin Raymond Walker decided to travel to Scotland. Again the details are vague. But certainly while they were there they met two young ladies in their twenties – Helen Murray and Margaret Cormack. Raymond and Helen formed a friendship and Albert and Margaret formed a friendship. It wasn't long before romance blossomed and the two young ladies came to settle in The Fountain Estate here in Londonderry.

Helen and Raymond were married in Saint Columb's Cathedral on 28th February 1976 – and just four months later on 26th June 1976 Albert Alexander Plews married Margaret McDowell Carruth Cormack. Both ceremonies were conducted by Dean George Good. In time Maureen and Jarvis were born, and subsequently grandchildren arrived:

Andrew, Alan and Mark, Jodie, Sophie, Charlie and Lacey; and then the great grandchildren: Jackson, Amber, Paige and Wyatt.

Albert and Margaret and their family lived for some time at Lincoln Courts and Tullyalley, until settling in more recent times at Old School Field in Drumahoe.

For much of her time Margaret was a home maker, caring for Albert and their children, but she also found time to help other people in their homes in the community,

working in a community scheme founded by the late Glenn Barr.

When she wasn't caring for her family or working for other people Margaret liked to have time for herself and she found relaxation in crocheting. As Albert told me yesterday it kept her mind active and her fingers nimble!

For the past five years Margaret's health has not been good and she has been unable to get out and about as she used to do.

On Monday she was admitted to Altnagelvin Hospital where Albert – also a patient there – was thankfully able to visit her and to spend quality time with her as her health deteriorated and the call of God beckoned.

Margaret passed into the nearer presence of God on Wednesday, sorely missed by Albert, Maureen and Jarvis and their families, but they are so grateful for the love she showed them at all times.

Today is a difficult day for you as you say your earthly Farewell to a much loved wife, mother, grandmother and great-grandmother.

But the Word of God teaches us that although Margaret's physical presence is no longer with us here on earth, she is present with us through her spirit that lives on. And one day, in God's time, we will be reunited with Margaret in Heaven.

In the last book of the Bible – The Revelation of Saint John – we are shown a vision that John had of Heaven. As we read about this vision in the closing chapters of this book we see that Heaven is a lovely place. Those who are there are free from pains and worries.

They experience no hunger or thirst. Death and sorrow are unknown.

It is a place where people of many different nationalities live side by side and everyone is safe because God watches over them.

It is into this community that Margaret has now entered.

In this new home, prepared for her by Jesus, she is safe – free from the pains and ill health that have been so much a part of her life over the past five years.

Today we are naturally sad that Margaret has left us but we thank God for all that she meant to us and we leave her in the keeping of her God confident that she is at peace and that one day, in God's time, we will meet her again face to face.

The family home was at 10, York Street. Sadly, David's elder brother Billy passed away in 2013. Billy was an employee of the Royal Mail working initially here in the city and later in Belfast. This was not the only sadness to overcome the family as David's father Lexie passed away in November 1988. In the following year David and his mother Ruby moved to 50, Woodburn Park to live with David's cousin Ian. In 2003 Ruby passed away. David was educated at Ebrington Primary School and Clondermot Secondary School. In Clondermot he enjoyed taking part in the school's musical performances and he also performed in the Londonderry Amateur Operatic Society's presentations of 'The Gondoliers'. He sometimes joked about how he missed out on a career in the West End. He often spoke about the 1967 school trip to Wales during which the group climbed Snowdon. David enjoyed travel and he, with Ian, undertook many trips together including visiting family

and friends in England and on other occasions travelling to France, Germany, Belgium and Switzerland.

On leaving school in 1969 David was employed by Alexander Thompson and Co. Hardware Merchants Duke Street before moving in 1970 to Robert Smith and Co. Wholesale Chemists, Foyle Street and Drumahoe. He was made redundant when the company closed in 2001. The onset of illness prevented him from taking up further employment.

David was keenly interested in many sports, especially football. He was an avid supporter of Manchester United F.C. and on several occasions travelled to Old Trafford to watch them play. He also supported Derry City and in the 1960's, along with his father, attended many of their matches at the Brandywell.

David's faith formation would have been within the congregation at Ebrington Presbyterian Church where he would have attended Sunday School and Church. In recent years David may not have been a regular church attender. However, I know from my visits with him in Altnagelvin Hospital that he appreciated listening to the reading of the Psalms and the comfort of private prayers and thankfully I was able to spend some time with him in prayer just a few hours before he passed away. As I mentioned earlier, in recent years, David was afflicted by declining health. In 2021 he had hip replacement surgery which gave him increased mobility but shortly afterwards he was diagnosed with Parkinson's disease. He became seriously ill several weeks ago and was admitted to Altnagelvin Hospital suffering from a chest infection which ultimately led to his demise last Saturday.

Ian and the family have asked me to express their thanks and appreciation to the doctors, nurses and ancillary staff of Ward 22, Altnagelvin Hospital, who provided outstanding care for David in his last illness and to the Staff of Clarendon Medical, the Northern Ireland Ambulance Service, the District Nurses and his Carers who looked after him so well in the last few months. Ian also appreciated the support of David's nephew John who visited him daily in hospital.

A ship sails out to sea and we watch it from the shore. Eventually it disappears over the horizon and we say it is gone, however, it is not gone it has simply gone from our sight and people standing on another shore will say it is coming! So, it is with David. He is not gone, he has simply gone from our sight and he has been greeted on that other shore by those whom he knew and loved in this life and whom he had lost from his sight. He and they are now in the nearer presence of their Creator God and Saviour.

Today we extend our deepest sympathy and prayerful support to David's sister-in-law Iris, cousin Ian, his nieces Gillian (Australia), Elaine, Diane, Davina, his nephew John and their families and his cousins here and in England.

May God comfort you in your sadness and loss and David we pray 'That you may rest in peace and be raised in glory'. **Amen.**
