#### Dear Parishioners and Friends

Some words spoken by The Reverend Canon Robert Clarke at the beginning of the Sermon on Sunday 28<sup>th</sup> May struck

a chord with me. He was referring to the fact that in June he will be ordained forty years as a deacon.

He said, "It is a great privilege to serve the Lord. To wear a collar, surplice and cassock and to speak and witness for Him as we are all called to do."

The Reverend Canon John Merrick and I will celebrate the anniversary of our Ordination as a deacon in June. He will be ordained thirty-one years and I will be ordained forty-four years. How time flies!

It seems like only yesterday that I knelt at the Sanctuary steps of this Cathedral Church, with (The Reverend Canon) Sam McVeigh, and felt the weight of the hands of The Right Reverend Robin Eames on my head and heard him speak these words,

"Take thou authority to execute the Office of a Deacon in the Church of God committed unto thee; In the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost. Amen." (Note the wording – this was before the 'new' Prayer Book was introduced).

During the past forty-four years I have had the privilege of serving the Lord in these dioceses. In the Parish of Clooney; in the Parishes of Dunfanaghy, Raymunterdoney, Tullaghobegley (Killult), Gweedore (Bunbeg), Carrickfin and Templecrone (Dungloe); in the Parish of Castledawson; in the Parishes of Tamlaght O'Crilly Upper and Tamlaght O'Crilly Lower (Innisrush); and for the past six years in this Parish of Templemore.

It has been (and continues to be) a privilege and an honour to have served in these parishes and I hope and pray that I will have the health and strength to continue to serve the Lord in the future.

I thank God for His faithfulness in the past, His guidance in the present, and His continuing direction in the future.

There have been difficulties and challenges along the way. There have been sad times as well as happy occasions but the happy occasions have outnumbered the difficult times. It has been (and continues to be)

a privilege to have shared with individuals and families at special moments in their lives. The birth and baptism of a child; the marriage of a son or a daughter; the death and burial of a dearly loved member of the family.

When I reflect on my life and ministry within the Church of God I conclude that the God who called me has equipped me and given me gifts that I hope I have used and will continue to use as I speak and witness for Him in word and action.

Canon Clarke reminds me and you that this is something that all of us are called to do: to speak and witness

for God in our daily lives.

It is the privilege and the responsibility of all who have been made in the image and likeness of God, who have been signed with the sign of the cross at baptism, who have been welcomed into the family of God and are called His children, to live and work and witness for Him. Some of us are better ambassadors for Christ than are others; but we must all try. It is the responsibility not only of the ordained man and woman to live and work for Him. It is the responsibility of **EVERY ONE OF US.** 

May God help us all to love and serve Him better in the days to come.

#### **BROWNING PARENT CLUB OF THE APPRENTICE BOYS OF DERRY**



#### Long Live The King!

Some of us remember the last Coronation in 1953 and attended the street party where the tables were set out in the street as there was very little traffic in the afternoon and before the buses arrived to take the factory girls, nurses from Waterside Hospital and workmen home to locations like Goshaden, Ardmore, Fawney, Kildoag, Claudy and Dungiven. I can also remember my dog being sent on the bus to Dungiven but that is another story! The scene was set, flowers in appropriate colours were in place, Coronation napkins, Coronation logos on buns, scones with jam and fresh cream, traybakes, Coronation tea towels were available. Tony Crowe had loaned an Indian carved plaque with the words of the National Anthem. The Union Flag hung on the East End flagpole to celebrate. Saturday 6th May 2023, was celebrated inside the Cathedral. The Big Screen was prepared and checked; we hoped that the technology would work so that the Coronation Service could be viewed in the church.


Not only did it work but those attending were given an Order of Service of what was happening in Westminster Abbey!

There was the usual 'discussion' as different people were spotted. We wondered why the Wales family were late and what did the gowns look like without the coats and robes. The King's equerry Johnny Thompson from one of the Scottish regiments was discussed and then at the end of the service we spotted Alan Warke and Billy Moore; out of several thousand people, two Derry people were in the limelight.

We were delighted to have lots of tourists watching the service and at one time we had more than 100 people in the Cathedral enjoying the spectacle of the Coronation and enjoying the refreshments. It was a very moving service.

As the service ended the bells were chimed in the tower by Aubrey and Garth. On the previous evening Ulster Television featured Mark McFadden interviewing the 'venerable 91-year-old' Aubrey Fielding, Captain of the bellringers as well as Garth, Robert, Brendan, and Maurice. It was great to see the bells ringing in the tower (the camera had been left in the belfry on record) and to hear five bells being rung. Aubrey had rung at Queen Elizabeth's Coronation in 1953.

It was an enjoyable day sharing the experience with people from all over the world who enjoyed our cookies including cream puffs which many sampled for the first time. Thanks go to Ian who sourced the decorations and to Geraldine and Irene who supplied traybakes and those who helped with the tea, buttered scones, and tidied up afterwards. And then Covid19 struck..... **Elizabeth** 



#### Saint Columb's Cathedral, Londonderry Friday 5<sup>th</sup> May 2023 Vigil of Prayer on the Eve of the Coronation of His Majesty, King Charles III

970 years before the birth of Jesus Christ there lived a man in Israel.

His name was Solomon.

Solomon's father was King David to whom is attributed many of the Psalms.

Solomon was appointed King of Israel, in succession to his father, when he was twenty years of age and he reigned for 40 years.

His reign was considered to have been very successful and is known as 'The Golden Age'.

Solomon was renowned for his great building skills.

He oversaw the building of the first Temple in Jerusalem.

His wealth was also something that people talked about.

It is said that he was worth (in today's money) \$2 trillion.

It could be said that he needed every single dollar because we are told that he had 700 wives and 300 concubines to support!

But it was for his wisdom that Solomon is best remembered.

One night Solomon had a dream and in this dream God spoke to him. God said,

#### 'Ask what I should give you'.

Solomon could have asked for anything.

He could have asked for a long life, for more riches, for success over his enemies – but he didn't.

His response to God was this. 'Give your servant an understanding mind to govern your people, able to discern between good and evil'.

God was impressed that Solomon had asked for wisdom and He said, 'I will give you a wise and discerning mind: no one like you has been before you and no one like you shall arise after you.

I give you also what you have not asked, both riches and honour all your life; no other king shall compare with you. If you will walk in my ways, keeping my statutes and my commandments, as your father David walked, then I will lengthen your life.'

On tomorrow morning – almost 3000 years after the birth of Solomon –

Charles Philip Arthur George will be crowned King of the United Kingdom and Northern Ireland and Head of the Commonwealth, and his wife Camilla will officially become queen. The Coronation Ceremony - the 40<sup>th</sup> to be held at Westminster Abbey - will follow a form that has remained largely unchanged since 1066.

This evening, as we and many other people throughout the Nation and Commonwealth, meet to pray for King Charles III and for Camilla the Queen Consort, I wonder what thoughts will be going through his mind.

I wonder, particularly, if he will be re-reading and reflecting on the Biblical account of Solomon's dream.

If God was to speak this evening to our King as he spoke to Solomon thousands of years ago and say, 'Ask what I should give you',

I wonder what his response would be.

I suggest that he might not need to ask for more palaces and houses;

he has them in abundance.

I suggest that he might not need to ask for more riches;

it is said that he is one of the wealthiest men on this earth.

According to The Guardian his personal wealth is estimated to be £1.8 billion.

So, I suggest that, like King Solomon, his response should be:

Give your servant an understanding mind to govern your people, able to discern between good and evil.

I suggest that any prayer that King Charles might make at this time should include a request for the gift of wisdom and insight.

For the past number of months Charles has been the King.

He became King on 8<sup>th</sup> September 2022 following the death of his mother, Queen Elizabeth II. While he has been fulfilling many engagements as Head of State the full significance of his role and office may not have yet sunk in; and it will only be in the solemnity of tomorrow's ceremony that he might venture to ask himself, 'What have I done?' This is a role and office that, from an early age, he knew would one day be his. He has been heir-apparent to the throne since he was three years old. For the past 71 years he has been preparing himself for this great occasion – an occasion that will, I suspect, be tinged with some sadness as he recalls his dear mother.

It was from her that he learned all that he needs to know about being King.

She was his role model.

In her long life he saw Christian faith in action.

He witnessed her popularity and saw how people from all over the world and from all of the countries of the Commonwealth loved and respected her.

As he reflects on her long life and reign as Queen he will, hopefully, be seeking to follow in her footsteps and at the same time placing his own unique stamp on the Monarchy.

When he was the Prince of Wales, King Charles had many interests and was involved in many projects.

He was known to speak his mind and to comment on things that he liked and disliked. As King and Head of State he will have to keep his views and opinions to himself.

He may, however, share his views and experiences with the Prime Minister when they meet each week, and we can look forward to his Christmas Message shared with the Nation and Commonwealth on Christmas Day.

In public the wisdom that has been gained over seven decades will be silent but in private I'm certain that individuals and groups will continue to benefit from his wide range of interests.

The charities that he founded in the past will continue in one way or another to receive his support, and the environment about which he is so passionate will not be forgotten either. During the Coronation Service, King Charles will take an oath promising to rule according to law, to exercise justice with mercy, and to maintain the Church of England.

One of the titles that he holds is **Defender of the Faith and Supreme Governor of The Church of England.** 

As Supreme Governor of The Church of England King Charles plays a part in its life and governance.

Although his authority over The Church of England is largely ceremonial and is mostly observed in a symbolic capacity the position is still relevant to the Church.

He formally appoints archbishops, bishops and deans of cathedrals on the advice of the Prime Minister of the United Kingdom.

The Christian Faith was not only important – but was the bedrock upon which Queen Elizabeth II lived her life.

We trust that King Charles will also find spiritual insight in the Christian Faith and in his personal relationship with God and His Son Jesus Christ.

It is well known that King Charles also has a love and respect for people of other world religions and those of none.

While living in accord with Christian teachings and principles, his hand will continue to be extended in friendship and solidarity

to all people who are made in the image and likeness of God.

This evening, as we meet in this part of the Realm we pray sincerely for King Charles III and for Camilla, the Queen Consort, that God would bless them and that they in turn would be a blessing to others as they serve their God and People for many years to come.
